Part One: Gown of the Year 1974

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Local artist and former Gordon Institute Textile Design student Kaz McGlynn was awarded the bronze medal for this stunning formal race wear ensemble.

We're proud to be showcasing this new addition to our collection.

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The four-piece gown consisting of top, skirt, culottes and cap is constructed in a Jersey Tricel fabric of a light champagne colour.

Circular discs in hot pink and purple are based on spaceship designs and printed with a silk screen process using the designer's own chemical dyes.
